Aspiration / Contribution Statement

I believe Tribe FM provides a unique and invaluable service to our local community and I aim to use my skills and experience to support the delivery of that service.

Experience

- I first got involved in community radio in 1986, in Sydney.
- I was a volunteer for Radio Skid Row (2RSR, inner Sydney community radio station). Over four years, I performed, at one time or another, almost all of the roles required to operate a radio station, including on-air, production, training, tech, accounts, admin, etc.
- In 1987, I designed, and managed the construction of, a new broadcast studio for Radio Redfern (Aboriginal community radio station, sister station of RSR).
- In the early 2000s I was a member of the board of management of Brisbane community radio station, 4ZZZ, and performed some technical and ICT functions for that station.
- In 2006 and 2007, I worked in Afghanistan, as a technical adviser for Internews, an international non-government organisation which built and maintained community radio stations across Afghanistan (of which there were about 32 at that time), and provided a satellite based content distribution service to those stations.
- Part of my role there was to manage a project to build five new radio stations in the remote Laghman province.
